

COMPREHENSIVE IMMIGRATION REFORM ADVANCEMENT ACT (CIRAA) — Amendment Window Version

TITLE I — PURPOSE AND DEFINITIONS

Section 101. Purpose

To establish expedited procedures for consideration of comprehensive immigration reform legislation, including:

- 1. A Senate Immigration Reform Commission;
- 2. A House Immigration Reform Commission;
- 3. A limited amendment window for member input;
- 4. A conference committee to reconcile Senate and House bills; and
- 5. Up-or-down final passage without filibuster.

Section 102. Definitions

- (a) "Senate Commission" the Commission established in Title II.
- (b) "House Commission" the Commission established in Title III.
- (c) "Implementing bill" legislation containing Commission-approved statutory language and administrative action.
- (d) "Amendment Window" the period during which Members of Congress may submit amendments to a Commission's draft for consideration.

TITLE II — SENATE IMMIGRATION REFORM COMMISSION

Section 201. Establishment

A Senate Immigration Reform Commission is hereby established.

Section 202. Membership

12 Senators:

- 6 appointed by the Majority Leader
- 6 appointed by the Minority Leader

Section 203. Approval of Proposal

A Senate proposal is adopted by **simple majority** (7 members).

Section 204. Timeline

Commission must submit its implementing bill within 180 days of first meeting.

Section 205. Amendment Window

- (a) Upon drafting a final Senate proposal, the Commission shall announce an **Amendment Window** of **10 legislative days**.
- (b) Senators may submit amendments in writing to the Commission.
- (c) The Commission may adopt, modify, or reject amendments by simple majority.
- (d) The Commission must provide a **written explanation** for all rejected amendments.

TITLE III — HOUSE IMMIGRATION REFORM COMMISSION

Section 301. Establishment

A House Immigration Reform Commission is hereby established.

Section 302. Membership

16 Representatives:

- 8 appointed by the Speaker
- 8 appointed by the Minority Leader

Section 303. Approval of Proposal

Adopted by simple majority (9 members).

Section 304. Timeline

Commission must submit its implementing bill within 180 days of first meeting.

Section 305. Amendment Window

- (a) Upon drafting a final House proposal, the Commission shall announce an **Amendment Window** of **10 legislative days**.
- (b) Members may submit amendments in writing.
- (c) The Commission may adopt, modify, or reject amendments by simple majority.
- (d) A public explanation of rejected amendments is required.

TITLE IV — EXPEDITED PROCEDURES IN THE SENATE

Section 401. Introduction

Upon submission, the Senate Commission's implementing bill is **automatically introduced** and referred to committee for **no more than 30 days**, after which it is discharged.

Section 402. Floor Consideration

- (a) Motion to proceed is **non-debatable**, requires **simple majority**.
- (b) Debate limited to **20 hours** equally divided.
- (c) No floor amendments, except those adopted by the Amendment Window.
- (d) Final passage requires simple majority, no filibuster.

TITLE V — EXPEDITED PROCEDURES IN THE HOUSE

Section 501. Introduction

Upon submission, the House Commission's implementing bill is automatically introduced, referred to committee for **no more than 30 days**, after which it is discharged.

Section 502. Floor Consideration

- (a) Considered under a special rule reported by the Rules Committee providing:
 - Limited debate
 - No amendments except those adopted by the Amendment Window
 - Simple-majority vote

TITLE VI — CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

Section 601. Convening

If both chambers pass implementing bills, measures go to a conference committee:

- Equal Members from both chambers and both parties
- Convene within 5 days
- Report conference report within 60 days

Section 602. Consideration of Conference Report

- (a) Fast-track procedures:
 - 1. No floor amendments
 - 2. Limited debate (10 hours each chamber)
 - 3. Senate: no filibuster, simple majority
 - 4. House: simple majority under special rule
- (b) If approved, the bill is sent to the President.

TITLE VII — DEFAULT BILL MECHANISM

If a Commission fails to submit a bill:

- Senate: any proposal supported by 4 Senators can be fast-tracked
- House: any proposal supported by 6 Representatives can be fast-tracked

This prevents total obstruction.

TITLE VIII — SUNSET

Authority expires **7 years** after enactment, except that any implementing bill or conference report already submitted continues under this Act.
